- **Campus Beautification** - Facilities and Services Operations staff are focusing on beautification and maintenance tasks in support of the fall semester. Facilities Maintenance and Custodial Services are performing detailed maintenance and cleaning tasks in the dormitories and vacant housing units. Facilities Maintenance and Structural Maintenance are performing scheduled maintenance in classrooms and academic buildings. In addition, Grounds is focusing on improving the appearance of Family Housing and the rest of campus. Facilities and Services is striving to make a lasting first impression on student and their families as they attend an Aggie Welcome Orientation and arrive for Move-In Day.



- **NMSU Golf Course-** Junior Golf Camp had a full class at the NMSU Golf Course this week. Over 200 participants are expected over the course of the summer.

- **Sustainability and Efficiency** - Operations has received 4 Bigbelly solar powered compacting trash receptacles with an attached recycling bin. Two units have been placed at the Southwest corner of Guthrie Hall, and the Northwest entrance at Education Services Building. A third will be placed on the International Mall near the entrance to Corbett Center. Upon completion of the construction and landscaping at the Undergraduate Learning Center, the last unit will be placed near the intersection of McFie Circle and the International Mall. The units were purchased to help promote recycling



and decrease the frequency of trash removal. The trash receptacle is programmed to auto text Grounds personnel when removal is required. This will allow the Grounds staff to devote additional time to performing additional tasks and maintain the campus appearance.

- **Pan American Center Hosts Conference** - The Pan American Center completed its 2<sup>nd</sup> weekend of successfully hosting the Jehovah Witness conference with the total attendance for both weekend events over 30,000.
