• QR Code - Facilities Maintenance, Custodial, and Grounds are busy preparing Housing units for move in day. The crews have been working diligently to correct all deficiencies to ensure a great experience for the incoming students. To help the students report problems with their residences, Al Flores has created an informational flyer complete with a QR code that is linked to the customer request for reporting problems. The QR code will streamline the maintenance process and improve the departments response time for repairs.



- **Backyard Blitz** Facilities and Services participated in the Housing Backyard blitz on Sunday August 9, 2015. The residents were asked to clean up their yards and place the items in roll off dumpsters. To help the residents, Facilites and Services personnel drove through housing and picked up items in the curb as well as helping residents carry items out of their back yards. A total of 6 tons of bulk items, yard waste, and trash was collected and transported to the landfill.
