- **NMSU Awarded 2015 NMAEE Energy Project of the Year** - Pat Chavez, Director of Mechanical, Electrical & Plumbing attended the 2015 New Mexico Association of Energy Engineers (NMAEE) awards banquet in Albuquerque on September 22, 2015. He was representing the NMSU Energy Performance Contract implementation team who won the 2015 NMAEE Energy Project of the Year award for the NMSU Energy Performance Contract project. The project is the largest contract to date in the state and the largest projected energy savings associated with an energy project. The NMSU management team consists of Joni newcomer, Pat Chavez, Dale Harrell, and Jose Loera.



- **NMSU Golf Course Hosts** - The Western New Mexico Invitational will be hosted here for the first time on Sunday with 25 Division II Golf Teams participating. This is being held in advance of the NCAA Division II Super-Regional Golf Championships that we will be hosting in May.
- **EHS provides Lab Safety Refresher Training for ACES Researchers** - On September 18, four Environmental Health & Safety trainers provided the first of the Lab Safety Refresher Classes for 2015 to 137 lab employees from the Colleges of Agriculture, Art and Sciences, and Engineering. - **Special Events** - Thanks to all who assisted with the successful management of the first two football games: Facilities & Services, Sodexo Dining, Information Technologies, NMSU Police/Fire Departments (and local Police and Fire Departments), Intercollegiate Athletics, Auxiliary Services, Parking & Transportation, and our staff of over 200 students. The football home opener was the largest single game ticket sale in recent years (over 20,000). Implementation of new processes resulted in a minimum of issues and a positive game day experience.

- **Credit Card Meters** - 20 credit card meters have been installed on a trial basis in the Horseshoe, O'Donnell Hall lot 55, and Zuhl Library lot 45.
- **Coaches Luncheon** - Over 100 participants attended the Coaches Luncheon on Sep. 18th at the Fulton Center, 3rd Floor Bistro. Sodexo had successful concession activities at the first home game and UTEP game.
- **Real Food, Real People** - Sodexo Campus Dining recognizes the hard work and unique contributions of its valued employees. This week, Taos Restaurant featured mancha mantel, a favorite dish of resident dining employee Claudia Molina.
