New NMSU Tradition-Raising the Garrison Flag: NMSU will be flying the Garrison



flag on Wednesday, November 11, 2015, as part of NMSU's Veterans Day activities. Grounds personnel will raise the flag at sunrise and volunteers from Veterans Affairs and Military Programs will lower the flag at dusk. Tim Dobson and Art Lucero met with Jacobo Varela, Director of Military and Veterans Programs, to coordinate the event and look forward to this becoming a new tradition at NMSU.

- ICT begins blocking certain email file attachments from the local Exchange email server: With each passing semester, the number and sophistication of cyber attacks on NMSU's network and computing systems increases. One such attack involves the use of email attachments containing malicious programming code that hijack computers, inject tracking software, and steal passwords and personal information. To counter the proliferation of malicious email attachments, ICT is now blocking attachments of certain file types (.zip, .cab, .cmd, and many others) from being transmitted on the local Exchange email server. Faculty and staff can send legitimate files of the blocked types by renaming the files --- for example: filename.zip to filename.piz. The receiver of the file would then rename it back to the original name --- filename.piz to filename.zip.
