- **ICT Intercepts Harmful Email:** Using a sophisticated monitoring device known as Ironport, ICT security and systems staff blocked over 93 million suspect and potentially harmful email messages on February 29th, 2016. The messages, which were sent to NMSU email addresses, were identified as containing viruses, SPAM, or other potentially malicious content or originating from untrusted sources. John Roberts, Chief Information Security Officer and Director of Computer Systems, stated, “We need everyone at NMSU to do their part by being careful not to open suspicious email that may have slipped through our security. If you receive a message you’re unsure of, contact abuse@nmsu.edu, and we’ll give it a look.”
 - **Greek Week 2016:** On March 3rd and 4th, approximately 400 students participated in the Greek week services days. During the first day, emphasis was placed on campus beautification. Volunteers worked with a Grounds crew to clean up vacant back yards in Student Family Housing. Another group worked with the Sign Shop to touch up the paint on campus building signs. On the second day, the volunteer students continued with back yard clean up, planted new flowers in the Chamisa village planters and painted the “A” on A Mountain. Operations appreciates the extra help provided by the student organization and look forward to next year’s event.
 - **Student Programming at Taos:** Themed dinner highlighting BBQ Blues. This special Elite Event intended to “chase students’ blues away” featured smoked beef brisket, Carolina BBQ pulled pork, Thai barbecue chicken, macaroni and cheese, Southern coleslaw, ranch-style beans and grandma’s cornbread.
 - **Recycle Mania 2016 Tournament:** NMSU is participating in the annual Recycle-Mania competition from February 7 to April 2, 2016 in the Grand Champion category. This is our seventh year to participate and there are 305 universities competing in that category. Currently, we are in fourth place with six weeks left in the competition. Korina joined the NMSU Fire Department (NMSU FD) in December of 2015 having already obtained her National and NM Emergency Medical Technician-Basic licenses. Since joining NMSU FD, she has completed the Defensive Driver, FEMA Incident Command 100-200, obtained the Respirator Fit Test card and successfully completed the Firefighter Basic Skills Evaluation. In addition to all the Firefighter training, Korina attends NMSU's main campus where she is pursuing a degree in Chemical Engineering with an anticipated graduation date of May of 2020.
