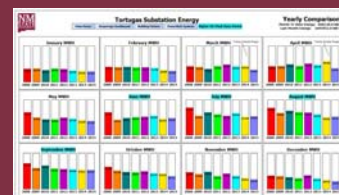

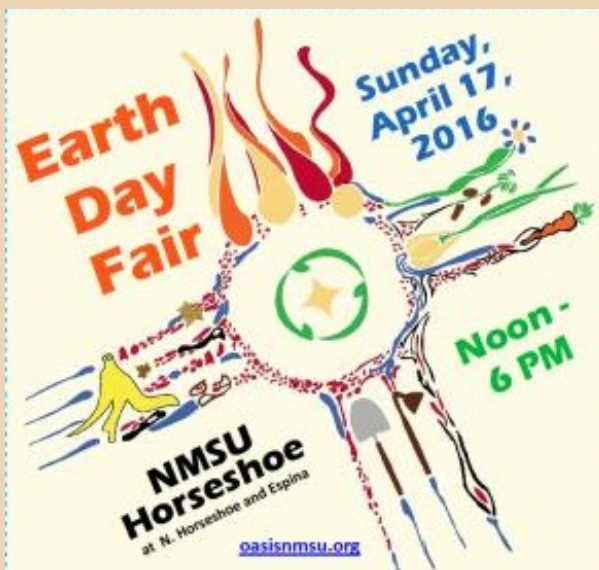
Environmental Science Student Organization has a busy 2016 planned! Join the group in Skeen Hall N120 Tuesdays from 5:00 - 6:00 p.m.

- Earth Day tie-dye T-shirts booth and fund-raiser

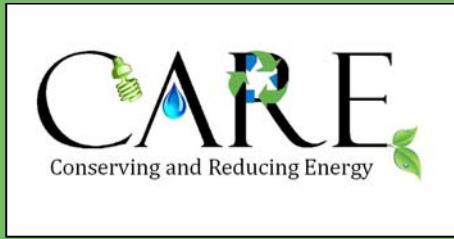
